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ABSTRACT

The aim of this study is to investigate the relationship between Maternal Acceptance/Rejection and Spiritual well-being in Young Adults. Therefore hypothesizing that there is a significant relationship between maternal acceptance/rejection and spiritual well being in young adults. The research will focus on finding the co-relational effects between the two variables. In order to empirically test this, Parental Acceptance/Rejection Questionnaire (Rohner & Khaleque, 1984) and of Spiritual Health and Life Orientation Measure (Gomez and Fisher, 2003) was administered on a convenient sample of 100 participant (Male= 50, Female= 50) from different universities in Karachi. The participants belonged to an age bracket of 18-24. The results indicated that there is no significant relationship between the two variables however there was an indication of weak negative correlation (r = -.131, p<0.194). Significant negative correlation was found between Maternal Acceptance/Rejection and the transcendental subdomain of the spiritual well-being (r = -.226, p<0.024). A non-significant negative correlation exists between Maternal Acceptance / rejection and Personal Subdomain (r = -0.26, p< 0.8); Communal Sudomain (r = -.112, p< 0.269) and Environmental Subdomain (r = -.007, p<0.941).
