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#### **Abstract:**

This study investigated the national drinking water policy and its practices in the region of Islamabad in Pakistan. The prime focus of the study was to examine the drinking water policy and the gaps between theory and practices of the citizens against it. This is a qualitative research conducted via in-depth interviews and theory content analyses. It is a cross sectional study. The emerging theme of the study was the lack of implementation of policy which leads people to extract water through alternative systems that are prohibited in policy.
